Course aims

By the end of the course students will have acquired the basic skills to analyse the most common types of academic writing (abstracts, short essays, bibliographical annotations, etc) and to deliver effective oral presentations (Power Point slideshows). The course will enable students to prepare themselves for their final written paper, and for the discussion of the same, by acquiring methodological and linguistic skills appropriate to the context of academic writing.
