Course Objectives

The course aims to introduce students to the study of the fundamental elements of French linguistics, the historical evolution of French, and its variants outside of France. Through the reading and analysis of several texts in the field of linguistic mediation, the course also aims to enrich students' lexical knowledge.

Course Content

Linguistics: phonetics, morphology, syntax, and pragmatics.

Language History: study of the diachronic development of French in its essential stages, its spread throughout the world (varieties of French), and its particularities, in terms of diatopic, diastratic, and diaphasic variables.
